

No Liars Are in Heaven

"Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, but those who act faithfully are His delight." That's in Proverbs 12, verse 22.

Greetings dear YouTube Family, this is Mother Elisabeth and today Jesus wants to address the topic of lying.....I can feel you all cringing.....I'm right there with you. Several people have asked me recently and in the past, is it okay to lie if we are doing the Lord's work? Let me give you a true life example.

A Christian woman is married to an Atheist and all day long she labors for the Lord, when her husband comes home and asks about her day, she will lie and say she was visiting so and so in order to cover the fact that she is working for God's Kingdom. The wife's concern is that her husband will become so enraged if he knew the truth, that he will divorce her and she will have no provision.

Why do we lie and allow the enemy to gain entrance into our lives and our relationships? Well, several reasons spring to mind. It starts with a single lie and then grows organically from there, and before you know it you have a bonfire of lies that you have to keep track of, peace of mind will not find you and you will have no rest.

We also self protect and therefore, self deceive, we lie because if we tell the truth we know the outcome will not bow well for us and we error by assuming the better path is tell a few white lies. We develop a habit of lying and rationalize in our minds that we are doing the right thing, especially if it's for the Lord or we will hurt someone's feelings.

Brothers and Sisters, there are no liars in Heaven, does it not say in Psalms 101:7, *"No one who practices deceit shall dwell in My house; no one who utters lies shall continue before My eyes."* Some of you may be thinking are there any exceptions? Let's look at that.....According to Scripture, God himself "does not lie" (that's in Titus 1:2). In His holiness, He is incapable of lying. As the apostle John put it, *"God is light; in Him there is no darkness at all"* (that's 1 John 1:5). Lying is sinful because God can't do it. It is clearly not God's plan for His people to harbor darkness or deception in their hearts. Even though the Lord may use us when we lie, it doesn't mean we are not sinning when we do.

Jesus began speaking, *"I commend My people for their faith, not for their lies. Look at Rahab, her good deed was that of welcoming the spies in peace. By faith she risked her life. Rahab trusted the living God more than she feared the king; therefore she and her family were saved."*

"Lying is more perilous than it seems dear ones. It's Satan-like to lie. I referred to Satan as "a liar and the father of lies" (that's John 8:44) and by contrast, I declared myself to be the Truth (that's John 14:6). Let me emphasize what happens when you lie, it opens the door widely for the enemy to pounce on you and your relationships. Lying is very damaging and it sows discord, distrust and division. I abhor

deceit and false witness, and how this hinders our relationship. I implore you to please repent of this unrighteousness and sin no more. If you could see what I see when you deceive, you would stay on the side of truth in all circumstances.

“Your actions, precious ones, need to line up with your words and what you are speaking in others’ hearing. As My witnesses on earth, you are representing Me, therefore what comes forth from your mouths must reflect love, truth and wisdom. Avoid blurting out unkind thoughts and find creative ways to speak the truth in love. Do not be slow to face the truth of the contrast between your character and Mine. Recognize triggers that may tempt you into sin and overcome them by laying them at my feet, repenting, and we will conquer them together.

“If you all will embrace the full goodness of the Truth and avoid the evil of lying, you will have peace, you will have rest. Lies result in chaos, not community. My way is for you to dwell together in harmony and in communion with Me. When you lie, you breach your connection with other people and with your God. I ask you to strive to be truthful as a way of cultivating closeness with Me and with your brothers and sisters. The joy and peace you will experience in this union will be heavenly and beyond compare!”

And that was the end of His message.
